Family Carers

"A Family Carer is someone who, without payment, provides help and support to a partner, child, relative, friend or neighbour who could not manage without their help. This could be due to age, physical or mental illness, addiction or disability"





 One in ten people provide care for someone else



33% increase in those caring for 50+ hours every week



Carers save the economy £132 billion a year

Full-time carers twice as likely to have poor health

Changes to the law

- The Care Act put carers on an equal legal footing to the people they care for
- Children and Families Act rights for young carers for the first time in law
- Underpinning principle to promote wellbeing of carers: physical, mental and emotional wellbeing, participation in work, education and training, and social and economic wellbeing



What does the Care Act mean for carers?

- Prevention duty: Prevent Reduce Delay
- Information and advice specifically to meet the needs of carers
- Right to assessment on appearance of need
- Duty to meet needs identified National Eligibility criteria
- Duty to meet carers needs for support via a personal budget
- Carers should be consulted on care and support plans
- Young carers aged 16 and 17 entitled to transition support

Achievements in Year One

- Nearly 5,000 Carers actively accessed individualised support
- Over 30,000 individual interventions (actions) carried out
- Evidence of reducing demand on health and social care services Example: If they hadn't received support from Supporting Carers in Essex, 39% of Carers said they would have gone to their GP; 26% would have gone to Social Care
- Evidence that Supporting Carers in Essex is achieving significant outcomes for Carers

Example: 84% of Carers reported that Supporting Carers in Essex has helped them to maintain or improve their health and wellbeing

















Supporting Carers in South Woodham Ferrers

- Access to full range of Supporting Carers in Essex provision
- Currently actively supporting 66 carers in the SWF area
- Actively engagement with GP practices and pharmacies
- Awareness raising: e.g. Annual Town Meeting, stand at Asda in Carers Week, partnership working with Provide
- Allocated SWF area Carer Support and Development Worker seeking to develop a local carer support group
- Seeking to provide Day Care opportunities in SWF
